## **COMMUNION SUNDAY**

Here are some thoughts on participating in Communion at home with the regular 1st Sunday of the month practice. Holy Communion is a sacrament, an event that invites us into the very presence of the Living God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. There is an unexplainable mystery we will never understand on this side of Heaven. That God is present with all who come in faith to His Table.

The bread and cup are not the actual body and blood

of Jesus, but they are symbols that remind us that Jesus died on the cross so that all people could be forgiven and live with Him forever.

But they are more than just reminders! God promises to connect our spirits to Jesus' spirit when we eat and drink this meal. We typically do this together when we are gathered at church, but since we cannot do that right now, we will do it at home, knowing that God's spirit is wherever we are!

Paul was born in Minnesota; Joan in Nebraska. Both attended Covenant Churches faithfully which laid the foundation for their strong relationships with Jesus.



## **DOLLARS & SENSE**



As you can see, our giving is not quite meeting our expenses. We are asking those in our family who are able to consider increasing your offering so that we will not have to resort to spending any reserves.

Our Ministry Financial Plan (budget) for 2021 averages \$21K per month, which is about the same as 2020. But in 2021 we won't have the additional income of \$44,500 (PPP Loan and the Denomination support) received in 2020. Without making up this shortfall, fixed expenses such as salaries, insurance, rent, office and internet expenses consumes most of our income, leaving very little for discretionary ministry expenses.

Living through over a year of Covid has been a challenge and we are grateful for you who have faithfully supported ATN through this season. In this stressful time for our region and our economy, some of you are barely able to pay for food and rent or mortgage, so we understand that you are giving what you are able. But, if you are able we appreciate you prayerfully considering your giving, as together we seek to walk with our Lord Christ Jesus.



## **ATN KIDS**

Each month in ATNKids, our ATNKids toddlers and preschoolers focus on one of three Basic Truths: God made me, God loves me, and Jesus wants to be my friend forever. This Spring, we are doing that through these themes:

April - Fly a Kite: God's love is big.

May - Jump Jump: God's way is perfect.

June - Press Play: I can trust God.

We want our elementary schoolers (both in the K-2 group and in Grades 3-5) to understand three more Essential Truths: I can make the wise choice, I can trust God no matter what, and I should treat others the way I want to be treated. This Spring, our themes are these:

April - Reconnect: Build the Bridge

May - 5K: Run the Race

June - Press Play: Get in the mix.

#### What did Jesus do for us on Easter?


"He made the Easter bunny!" - Katherine, age 6
